

PCOC test is available from the **Kincardine CPS**

If you wish to challenge the test for the Pleasure Craft Operator Card contact CPS member Gordon Cale. Tests can be written by appointment by calling 395-2291 or by e-mailing to cales@hurontel.on.ca. The test is \$20. The Canadian Power and Sail Squadron also sells a self study book for \$20 that will prepare you for the test. The Canadian Power and Sail Squadron is authorized by the Canadian Coast Guard as a test provider.

Who Needs a PCOC?

If you were born after March 31, 1983 you had to show competency by September 1999.

If you operate a power boat of less than 4 metres (13.2 feet) you had to show competency by September 15, 2002. This covers personal water craft.

All other power boat operators must show proof of competency by September 15, 2009. Other changes in safe practice

You must be 16 to operate a Personal Water Craft.

Children under 12, not directly supervised may not operate a power driven craft over 10 hp. Those over 12 but under 16, not directly supervised may not operate a power-driven boat of more than 40 hp.

Southside Boat Club Dock Assignments **Dock Assignment:**

Kindly review the Dock Assignment List and notify the South Harbour Master, Paul Buttinger if your name appears beside a dock number you do not plan to utilize this year. Last year several assigned dock spaces continued to be vacant for the whole season. This year, in an effort to remedy this problem, if you do not have a dock in place by June 15th or make previous arrangements with Paul, the space automatically will be reassigned to another party.

Dock Name Placement:

Please remember membership rules also stipulate that assigned docks must be labeled. Kindly ensure labels are placed on each side of the dock with the surname of its occupier. Labeling the docks clearly will facilitate contacting the owner(s) more quickly if damages or unforeseen events occur to their dock during the season.

We appreciate your participation in this process so that we may continue to provide dock spaces to members on our waiting list. Thank you in advance, have a safe boating season and see you on the south side!




50 years of the Pine River Boat Club

It was about 50 years ago that the Pine River first became available as a safe harbour. Before that the mouth of the river silted closed every summer. The Spring flood would create an opening much like what occurs today at the Clark Creek. By August there was a solid bar across the mouth. It was Len Macdonald who first thought it was possible to keep a boat in the river and boat into the lake. I remember the first year he literally used a shovel to try to dig a small channel for his boat. In those days most boats were 14 feet or shorter and were run off the beach so only beach front cottages had access. The boat houses along the beach are a reminder of those days.

With the help of the old club records Janet Cress has expressed an interest in writing a history of the club. If you or your family have any pictures from the early days of the club please share them with Janet.
